LAWS OF MICHIGAN.

[No. 276.]

AN ACT to detach certain territory from the present township of Central Lake, in the county of Antrim, and organize the same into a separate township, to be known as the township of Echo.

SECTION 1. The People of the State of Michigan enact, That Central Lake and township number thirty-one north, of range number seven west, organised into a now forming a part of the township of Central Lake, in the county township by the name of Echo. of Antrim, be and the same is hereby set off from the residue of

said last named township, and organized into a separate township to be known as the township of Echo.

SEC. 2. The first annual meeting in said township of Echo shall First election, be held on the first Monday of April next, at the house of Noble when and where J. Marsh, in said township, and L. D. Cole, Edward Hebdin, and Inspectors of Calvin Bennett are hereby made and constituted a board of in-

spectors of said township election.

SEC. 3. If for any reason the township meeting provided for in or failure to hold . the last preceding section shall not be held at the time designated township meeting at time for holding the same, it shall and may be lawful to hold the same named. at any time thereafter, by giving at least fifteen days' notice of the time and place of holding such meeting, by posting notices thereof in four of the most public places in said township, which notice may be given by said board of inspectors, or a majority of them.

SEC. 4. If for any cause all or either of the inspectors hereby ap- Fallure of pointed shall neglect or be unable to attend said board at the time attend. specified, it shall be lawful for the electors of said township who shall be present at the time designated for opening the polls of said election to choose from the electors present suitable persons to act as inspectors of said election, in place of such inspectors who shall neglect or be unable to attend said board.

SEC. 5. This act shall take immediate effect.
